- Yesterday morning, in South Bend, Indiana (where Senator Evan Bayh is a target) a couple (Don and Kathy) walked up to me and Don said, "Tim, we got your email invite and drove 3 hours from Anderson to be here to send a message to these politicians."
- At the packed Detroit area event attended by over 200 fired-up folks, a tool maker who had just been laid off from his job of 30 years told me that "we've got to beat Cap-and-Trade because it's going to cause a lot more people to lose their jobs."
